LETTER FROM THE BOARD

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with requisite information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the AGM. The proposed resolutions include (i) re-election of Directors; and (ii) grant of general mandates to issue and to repurchase Shares.

2. RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The Board currently comprises twelve Directors, of which four are Executive Directors, namely Mr. LI Chao Wang, Ms. YU Yi Fang, Ms. ZHANG Dong Fang and Mr. DONG Yi Ping; four are Non-Executive Directors, namely Mr. Jan Christer JOHANSSON, Mr. Jan Lennart PERSSON, Mr. Johann Christoph MICHALSKI and Mr. Ulf Olof Lennart SODERSTROM; and four are Independent Non-Executive Directors, namely Mr. KAM Robert, Mr. HUI Chin Tong, Godfrey, Mr. TSUI King Fai and Mr. WONG Kwai Huen, Albert.

In accordance with Article 86(3) of the Articles of Association, any Director appointed by the Board to fill a casual vacancy of the Board shall hold office until the next following general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election at that meeting. Mr. WONG Kwai Huen, Albert who was appointed by the Board during the year, will retire at the AGM and, being eligible, offer himself for re-election at the AGM.

In accordance with Article 87(1) of the Articles of Association, at each annual general meeting of the Company, one-third of the Directors for the time being (save and except those Directors in respect of whom the provision of Article 86(3) applies) or, if their number is not three or a multiple of three, then the number nearest but not less than one-third, shall retire from office by rotation. The Directors to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last re-election but as between persons who became Directors on the same day, those to retire shall (unless otherwise agree between themselves) be determined by lot. Accordingly, Mr. LI Chao Wang, Mr. Johann Christoph MICHALSKI, Mr. Ulf Olof Lennart SODERSTROM and Mr. KAM Robert will retire by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

The biographical and other details of the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

3. GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND TO REPURCHASE SHARES

It will be proposed at the AGM to grant to the Directors (i) a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares up to a limit equal to 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing the relevant resolution and adding to such general mandate so granted to the Directors any Shares representing the aggregate nominal amount of Shares repurchased by the Company under the Repurchase Mandate and (ii) a Repurchase Mandate to purchase Shares not exceeding 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing the relevant resolution.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

As at the Latest Practicable Date, a total of 998,402,686 Shares were in issue. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution granting the Issue Mandate to the Directors and on the basis that no Shares will be issued and/or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Issue Mandate to issue a maximum of 199,680,537 Shares representing 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company at the date of the AGM.

The Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate would expire at the earliest of: (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; or (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles of Association or by any applicable laws to be held; or (c) the passing of ordinary resolution(s) by Shareholders in general meeting revoking or varying the authority given to the Directors.

An explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules to be given to Shareholders in connection with the Repurchase Mandate, is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

Completion and return of the form of proxy will not prevent you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof should you so wish.

5. VOTING BY POLL

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. Therefore, all the resolutions put to the vote at the AGM will be taken by way of poll. The chairman of the AGM will explain the detailed procedures for conducting a poll at the commencement of the AGM.

After the conclusion of the AGM, the poll results will be published on the website of the Stock Exchange and the website of the Company.

6. RECOMMENDATION

REASONS FOR REPURCHASE MANDATE

Whilst the Directors do not presently intend to repurchase any Shares, they believe that the flexibility afforded by the mandate granted to them if the ordinary resolution no. 6 set out in the notice of AGM is passed would be beneficial to the Company and its Shareholders. Trading conditions on the Stock Exchange have sometimes been volatile in recent years and if there are occasions in the future when Shares are being traded at a discount to their underlying value, the ability of the Company to repurchase Shares can be beneficial to those Shareholders who retain their investment in the Company since this may, depending on the circumstances, result in increases to the fully diluted net assets and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the total issued share capital of the Company is 998,402,686 fully paid-up ordinary Shares of HK\$0.10 each.

The exercise of the Repurchase Mandate up to 10% limit would enable the Company to repurchase 99,840,268 Shares.

SOURCE OF FUNDS FOR REPURCHASES

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds entirely from the Company's available cash flow or working capital facilities, which will be funded legally available for such purpose in accordance with its Memorandum and Articles of Association and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands. Such funds include but are not limited to the Company's profits available for distribution.

Whilst the Repurchase Mandate, if exercised in full, may have a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company, the Directors expect to exercise such mandate if and to such extent only as they are satisfied that the exercise thereof will not have such a material adverse impact.

UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the power of the Company to make purchases pursuant to Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the laws of the Cayman Islands and in accordance with the regulations set out in the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Company.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates, presently intend to sell any Shares to the Company under the Repurchase Mandate in the event that the latter is granted by the Shareholders.

The Company has not been notified by any connected persons of the Company that they have a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or that they have undertaken not to sell any Shares held by them to the Company, in the event that Repurchase Mandate is granted by the Shareholders.

TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of share repurchase by the Company, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or group of Shareholders acting in concert, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

The Directors have no intention to repurchase Shares which would result in the number of Shares in the hands of public falling below the prescribed minimum percentage of 25%.
